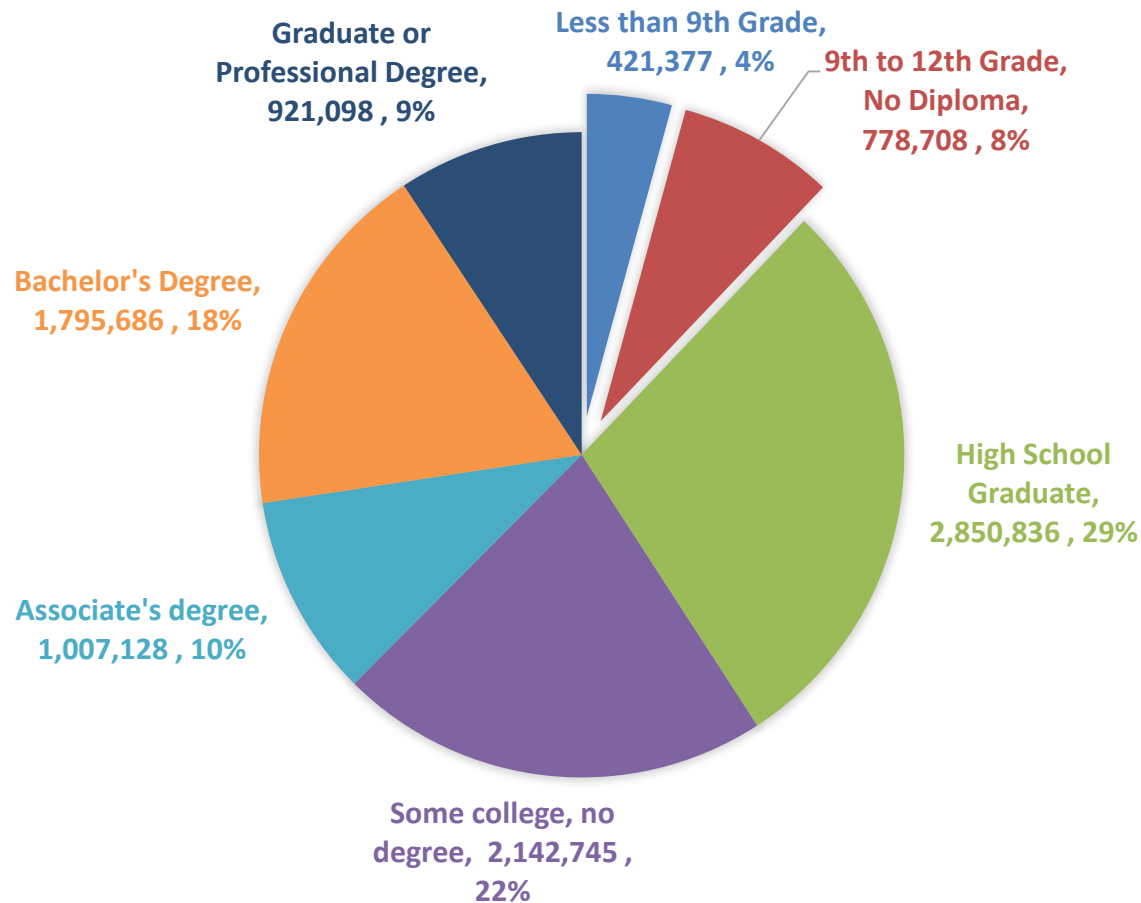

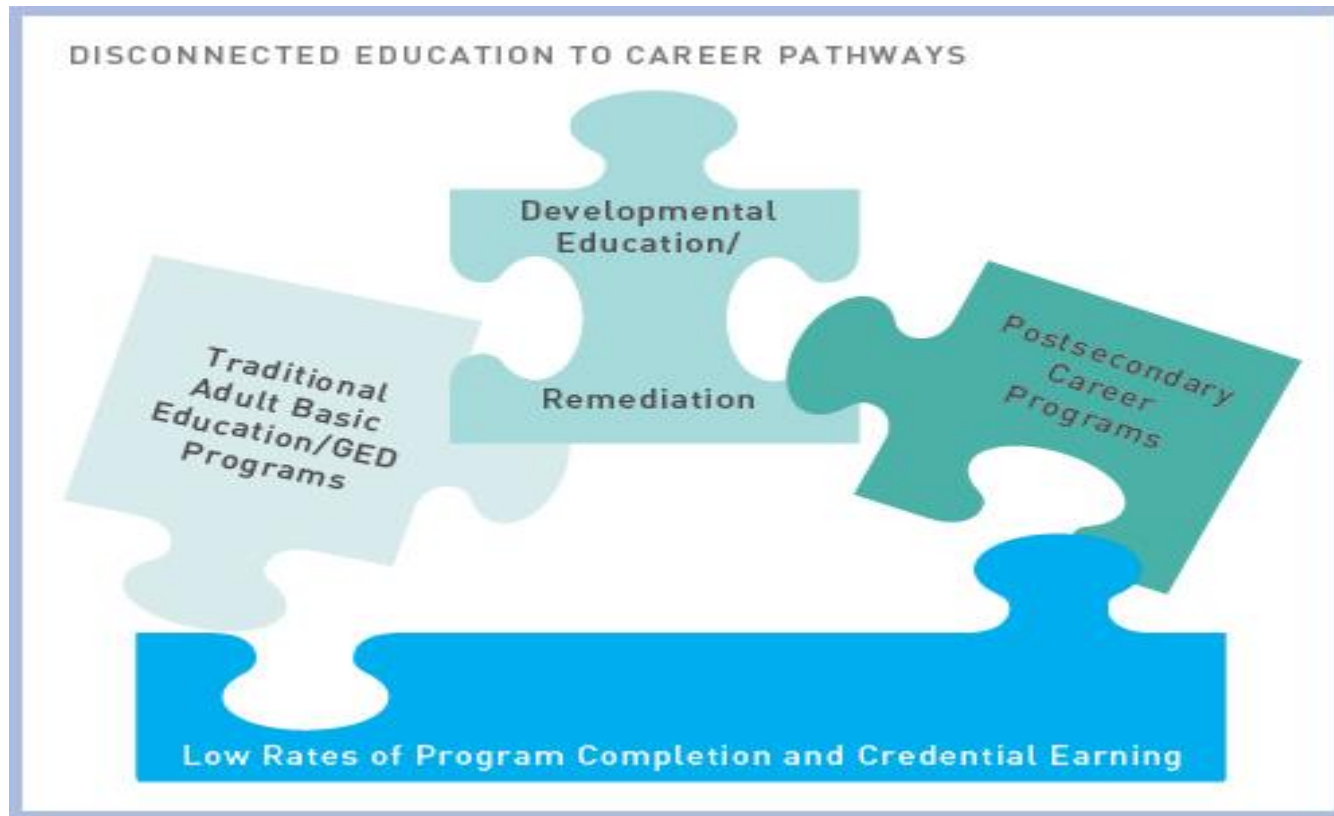

About 12% of Florida's Working Age Population Does Not Have a High School Diploma

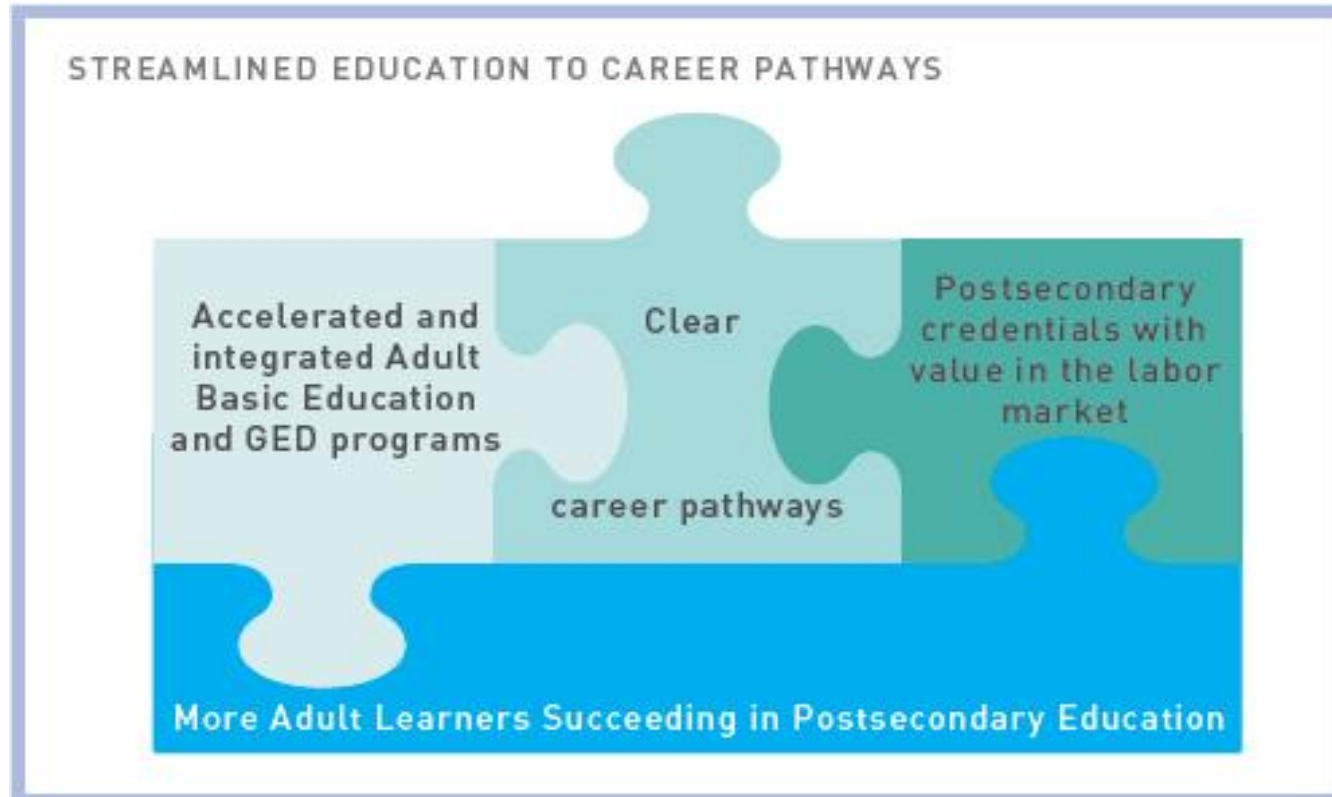
FLORIDA EDUCATIONAL ATTAINMENT, POPULATION, AGES 25 TO 64

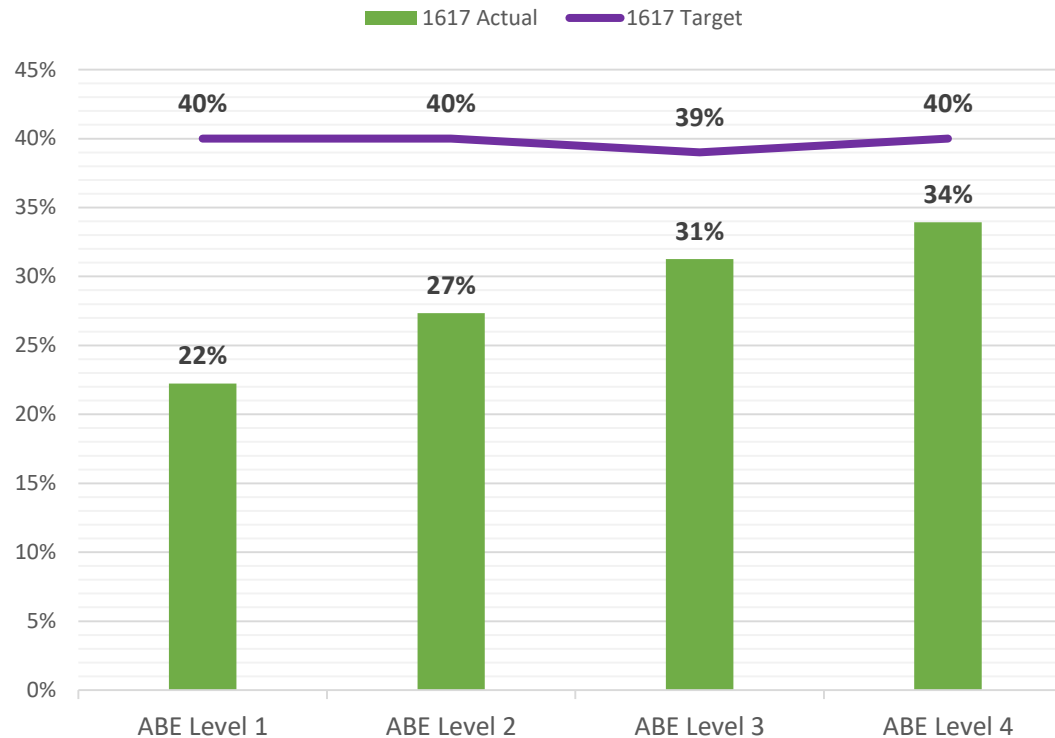

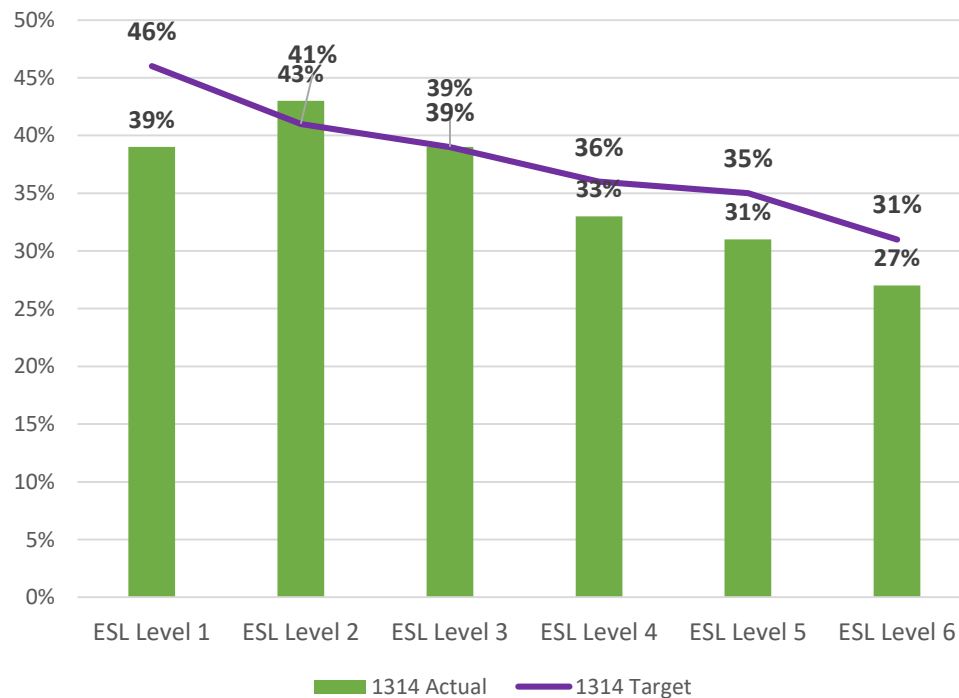

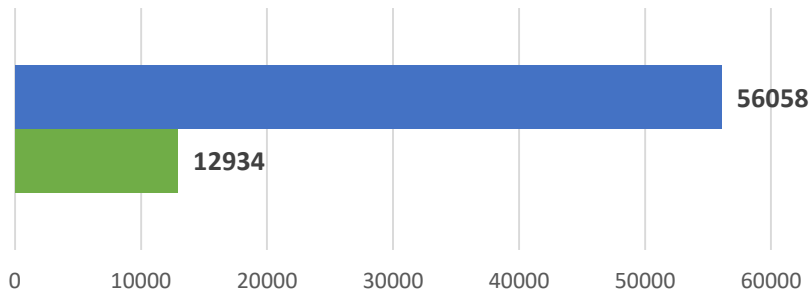
1617 ESL Performance by EFL

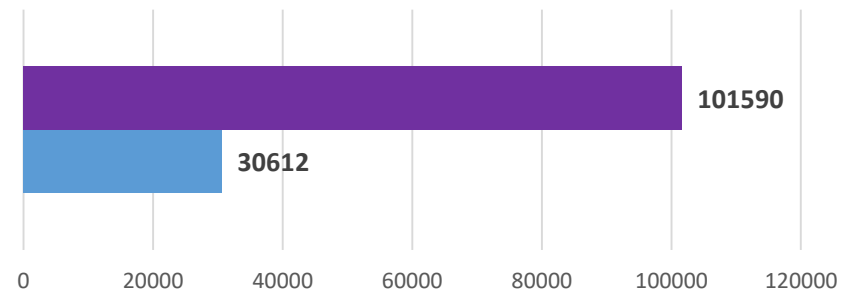
1617 ABE Participants and MSG

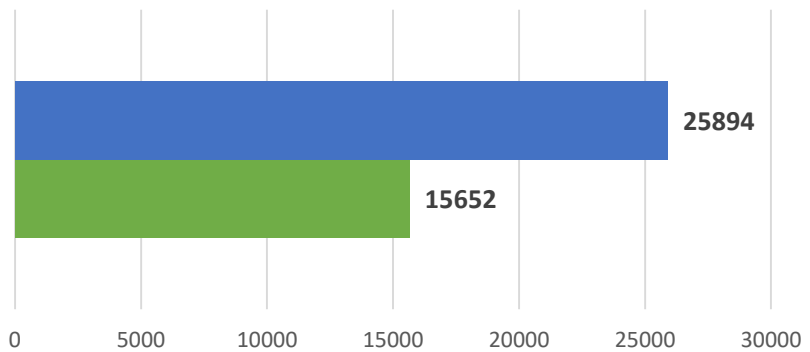

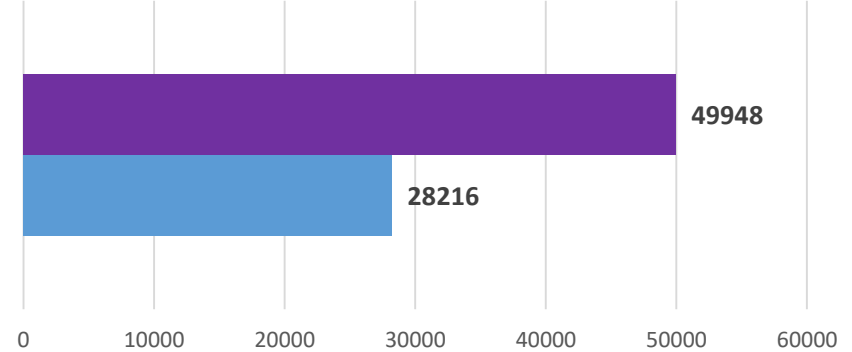
1617 ABE Participants Post-tested and MSG

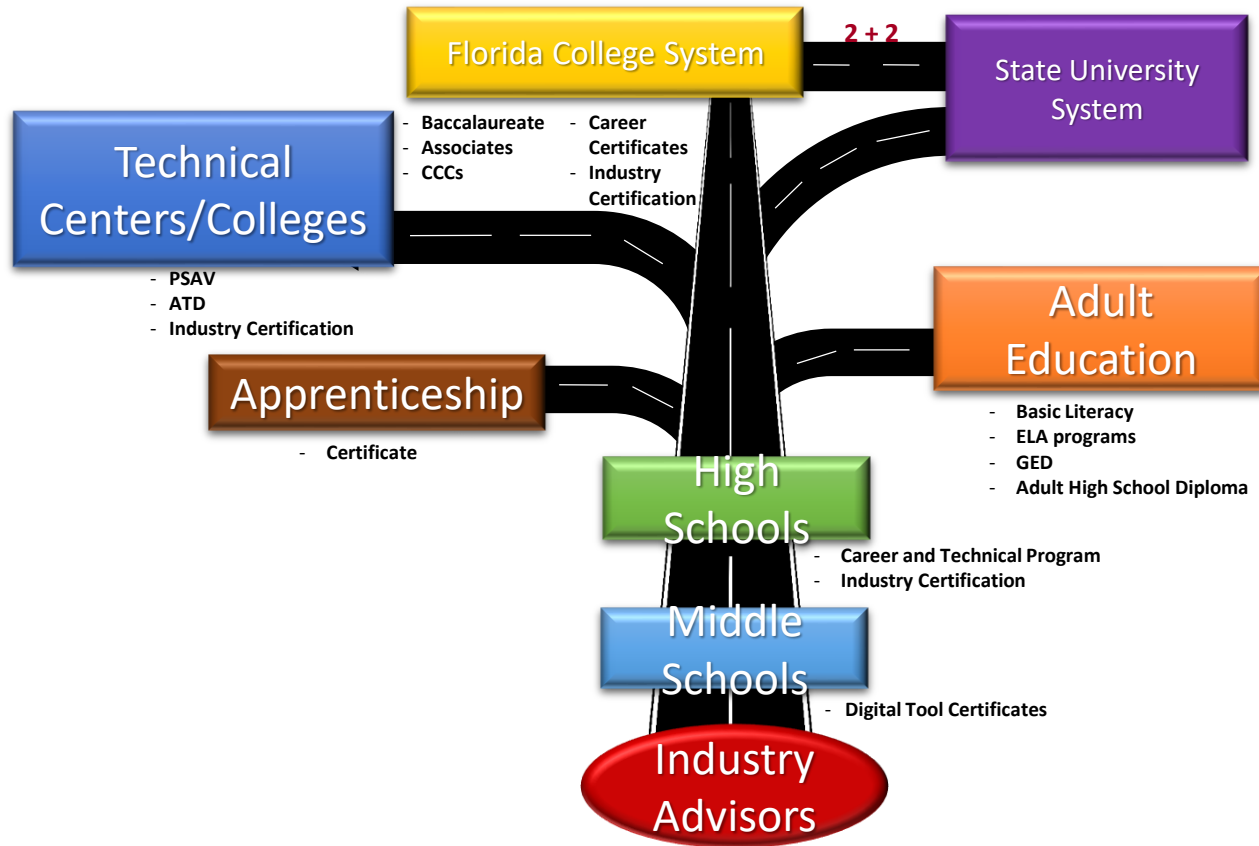
Pathway 1- Attainment of a Secondary Diploma or Equivalent

Florida's Career Pathway System Historical Information

- 2010-2012 Career Pathway Grants
 - Five year plans for building career pathway system
 - Career exploration and planning required
- 2014 WIOA Reauthorization – Introduction of Integrated Education and Training
- 2015-2016 Florida's Integrated Career and Academic Preparation System – (FICAPS)
 - Planning and implementation grants for pilots
 - Integrated education and training programs implemented
- 2016-2017 Florida's Integrated Career and Academic Preparation System – (FICAPS)
 - Second Year Grant
 - Included English Literacy for Career and Technical Education (ELCATE)

What is the Integrated Education & Training Program (IET)?

Workforce Innovation and Opportunity Act (WIOA) definition:

It is a service approach that provides adult education and literacy activities concurrently and contextually with workforce preparation activities and workforce training for a specific occupation or occupational cluster for the purpose of education and career advancement.

IET Program Components

Must Include:

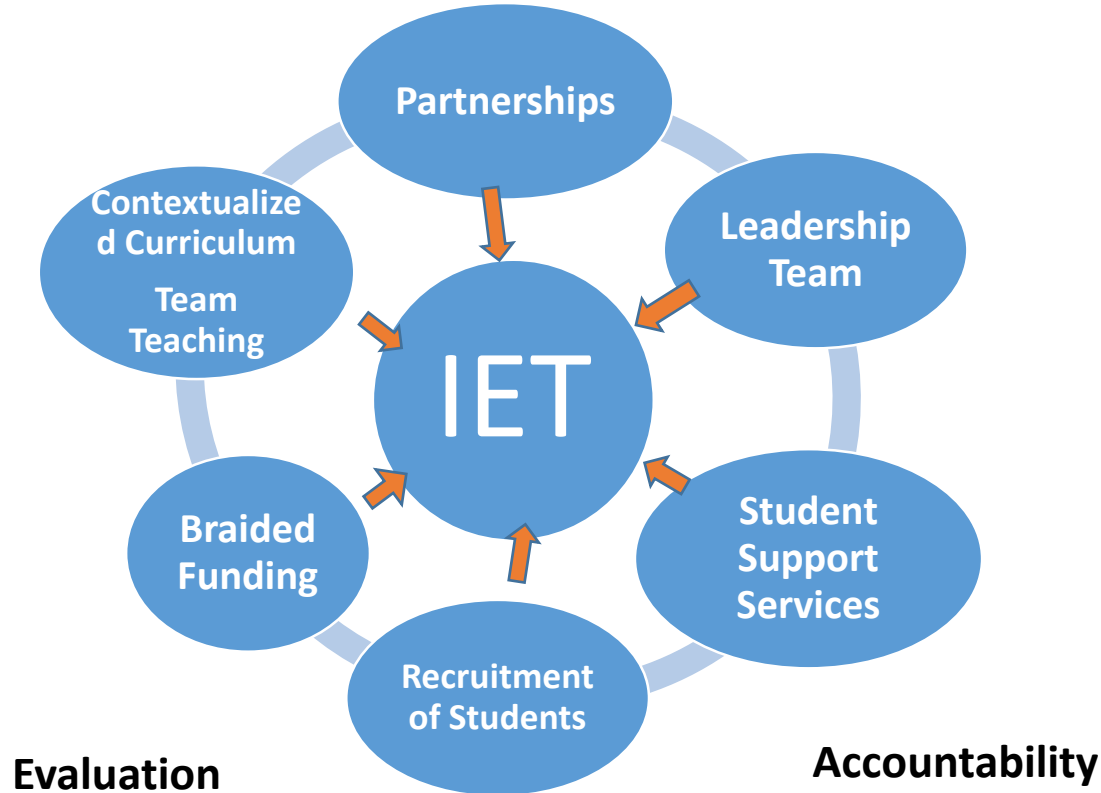
- Adult Education and Literacy Activities
- Workforce Preparation Activities
- Workforce Training (Specific Occupation or Occupational Cluster)

**Program should support the local and state workforce development board plans as required under WIOA

(**Regional in Demand Occupations**)

GED/ELCATE + CTE = Integrated Education and Training Program

Planning → Design → Implementation

Student must be enrolled as:

- Adult Basic Education (ABE) Student
 - Pre-IET - Bridge Program (Lower Level Students)
 - Student's progress is not reported to the NRS
- Adult General Education Diploma (GED®) Student
 - GED® - I
(Course #9900136)
- Adult English Speakers of other Languages (ESOL) Student
 - ELCATE (English Literacy for Career and Technical Education)
(Course #9900050)

GED[®] - Integrated

Student must pre-test at GE 9.0 or above in two of subject areas (Reading, Mathematics, Language Arts)



ELCATE

Student must be at NRS ESL Levels 5 & 6



Program Curriculum

- Provides Concurrent and Contextual Lessons
 - Sufficient intensity and quality based on the most rigorous research available to improve reading, writing, mathematics and English proficiency of eligible students
 - Occur simultaneously
 - Various models and timeframes
 - Use occupationally relevant instructional materials
 - Textbooks
 - Simulation models
 - Tools
 - Vocabulary

Standards & Frameworks Alignment

- All IET program components are aligned with the State Standards and Adult Education Curriculum Frameworks
 - GED® Integrated Preparation Comprehensive
 - English Literacy for Career and Technical Education (ELCATE)
 - Adult Basic Education

8. Facilitate Learning in Context

The state will consider:

Whether the eligible provider's activities provide learning in context, including through integrated education and training, so that an individual acquires the skills needed to transition to and complete postsecondary education and training programs, obtain and advance in employment leading to economic self-sufficiency, and to exercise the rights and responsibilities of citizenship;
