




Josh Davies is passionate about helping others make a difference in their lives, jobs, and community. Through his work as a speaker and trainer, he has engaged and encouraged professionals across North America, the Middle East, and Asia. His engaging and connecting speaking style combined with relevant content make him an in-demand speaker, giving more than 75 keynote presentations and workshops to education, workforce, and corporate events annually. Mr. Davies has been named by the Global Forum for Education and Learning as one of 2021's Top 100 Visionaries in Education in recognition for his contributions to education globally. Additionally, Training Magazine named him as one of the top 10 trainers under 40 in America and the Denver Business Journal tapped him as one of Denver's 40 Under 40.

Davies is currently the CEO of The Center for Work Ethic Development, an organization committed to developing workplace skills in the global workforce. Partnering with organizations in all 50 states and 6 countries, they equip trainers and teachers to build the workforce of the 21st Century. A graduate of American University, Josh has been awarded the Mile High Energy Award by Visit Denver, and an honorary Doctorate of Foodservice by the North American Food Equipment Manufacturers Association for his contributions to the industry. He finished serving his second term on the Executive Board of the Colorado Workforce Development Council, where he chaired the State Education and Training Steering Committee. He also led the P-Tech Selection Committee for Colorado and served on the board of the Colorado Opportunity Scholarship Initiative. In addition to his work in the public sector, Josh also served on the Board of Directors for the National Association of Workforce Development Professionals, was President of the Council of Hotel and Restaurant Trainers (CHART) and co-chaired the Colorado State Youth Council.

Nationally Invited Speakers



JEFFREY ABRAMOWITZ

Jeffrey Abramowitz, J.D is currently the Executive Director of Reentry Services for JEVS Human Services. Jeff is also the founder and President of Looking Forward Community Engagement Partnership, a non-profit agency that works with individuals who have barriers to gainful employment and provides staff training and development in the area of workforce development. Jeff was the founder of the National Workforce Opportunity Network, a fully integrated workforce development agency. Jeff has provided reentry agency support, staff training, and has facilitated reentry workshops and staff development training at Temple University, PA CareerLink Suburban Station, and throughout the country over the past three years, assisting returning citizens with their transition home from incarceration, helping them find their career pathway, gainful employment, and the road to prosperity. Jeff was most recently appointed to the Executive Board of the Coalition of Basic Adult Education, COABE, where he is the chairperson of the Prison Literacy Committee and sits on the Pennsylvania Reentry Council serving as Chairman of the Housing, Education, Employment, and Basic Needs Sub-committee.



VANIA AGUILAR

Vania Aguilar is a program manager at the Center for Advancement of Human Rights (CAHR), where she oversees the administrative work of the Center. She conducts trainings on human trafficking for various groups in the community. In addition, she oversees the Center's case management and service provision for human trafficking victims and victims of other crimes. She has developed curriculum for the Florida Department of Children and Families and the Florida Department of Education on human trafficking. She was granted BIA Accreditation in 2013 and is assisting clients with their VAWA, DACA, Adjustment of Status, asylum, SIJS, TPS, U and T visa application submissions. She has assisted over 300 refugees adjust their status to lawful permanent residence and also helps them apply for their citizenship. She has established direct connections with prosecutors, victim advocates and law enforcement officials throughout the state. She works very closely with them to secure the necessary documentation to apply for immigration relief for clients who are victims of crimes and to apply for any other forms of relief under the Victim's Compensation Program. She serves as a co-chair for the Big Bend Coalition Against Human Trafficking Survivor Support Committee. On behalf of the coalition, she has written co-eds, has participated on radio show interviews to discuss how Florida is affected by human trafficking, conducted presentations and outreach initiatives. In addition, she serves on the board of the Survive and Thrive Advocacy Center, a non-profit that assists victims and survivors of human trafficking in the second judicial circuit. She received a Bachelor's and a Master's degree in Multilingual/Multicultural Education from Florida State University. In addition to working for the CAHR, Ms. Aguilar has been teaching for Adult and Community Education (ACE) in Tallahassee since 2005 where she has taught evening classes to English learners from around the world. At this time, she is the lead teacher for the on-line English classes at ACE with a focus on naturalization. She conducts classes for adult students in which she incorporates information about services and remedies for victims of various crimes including human trafficking and prepares students for their citizenship process.

BROOKE ISTAS

Brooke Istas, consultant, adult education mathematics subject matter expert, and Cowley College Mathematics Faculty, is recognized nationally for her knowledge of mathematics and mathematical concepts, her immense understanding of mathematical concepts and continued dedication to supporting adults with their education goals; she has shown herself to be an asset to adult education and the greater mathematics community. She has given several presentations at state and national conferences on enhancing mathematical instruction, understanding higher level mathematical content, teaching math at a distance, and on-line instruction; always willing to share her learning with others. She understands that adult education is enhanced through collaboration with other adult education programs. She is also the Subject Matter Expert (SME) for the LINCS (Literacy Information and Communication System) Math and Numeracy, Correctional Education, and Financial Literacy Community of Practice; also, a reviewer for the Math/Numeracy online resource collection that is a part of the Basic Skills Collection. Brooke is the State Delegate from Kansas for the America Mathematical Association for Two Year Colleges. Additionally, Brooke is currently working on her Ph.D. in math education at Southern Methodist University.



JERRY PARRISH

Dr. Jerry Parrish is the Chief Economist and the Director of Research for the Florida Chamber Foundation. In that role, he is responsible for conducting in-depth analyses on the Florida economy and on solutions to help secure Florida's future. Dr. Parrish is currently an adjunct instructor in the Masters in Applied Economics Program at Florida State University. Dr. Parrish previously was the Chief Economist and Director of the Center for Competitive Florida at Florida TaxWatch. Prior to that position, he served as the Associate Director of the Center for Economic Forecasting & Analysis at Florida State University, and has many years of private-sector experience.



MARGARET PATTERSON

Dr. Margaret Patterson has over 15 years of research administration experience at the state and national levels, ran a statewide research and data analysis consulting business for seven years, and presents extensively around the country. She partners with non-profit organizations, postsecondary institutions, and state agencies, applying research to support adult educators and learners. 


