<p><i>Conquering Digital Literacy with Applied Digital Skills</i></p> <p>Presenter: Melinda Holt, PS II Technology Integration, Sacramento County Office of Education, Outreach and Technical Assistance Network (OTAN)</p>	<p>Digital skills are required - in education, employment, and collaborating with others, there is almost no aspect of our lives that exists without the need for digital skills and literacy. And to assist educators to help students conquer the skills they need, there is a free online tool where lessons are applied to real-world situations: Google's Applied Digital Skills.</p> <p>Applied Digital Skills is a free video-based curriculum designed to assist students (and teachers) learn digital skills. The lessons give step-by-step instructions through using the wide variety of Google apps and tools where users create projects based on practical life applications. Collaboration through email, creating simple or complex budgets, conquering presentations, or researching and writing reports are just a few of the skills taught. Teachers can create classes, monitor student progress, view projects, download results, and even connect directly to a Google Classroom or other learning platform. All of the skills learned within the Applied Digital Skills lessons are transferable. There will be a review of statewide adult education program performance followed by hands on data reporting technical assistance. Topics will include recent adult education test and performance reporting changes, performance-based funding, NRS accountability, IET data reporting, instructional hour reporting, ABE RLA data reporting, state MSG targets, posttest rates, and more. <p>Digital Access and Resilience in Beginning ESL Classrooms</p> <p>Presenter: Glenda Rose, Adult Education Director/Consultant, Community Action, Inc. of Central Texas</p>	<p>Integrating digital skills and resilience in classes for adult English language learners is essential to their job opportunities, civic engagement, and health outcomes, to name a few. But including digital skills in a class with students who may have never touched a keyboard can be overwhelming. Enter the DART curriculum. As a result of an identified need at Tyson Foods for team members in their ESL classes to become better with technology, the DART project developed over a period of nearly two years to provide concrete, practical ways for teachers to include digital skills from the first day of class - even if the learners have little or no first-language written literacy.
